WATER WORKS.

SEC. 518. The president of the city council and clerk of this city are empowered and directed to enter into a written agreement, under their hands and the seal of the city, with the Little Rock Water company, for supplying the city and inhabitants thereof with water, giving said company the exclusive privilege in respect thereof for the term of sixty years from July 15, 1871, on proper terms, and on condition that the works of said company shall be constructed within three years from said July 15, 1871, so as to supply this city and its inhabitants with all the water that may be needed by them.

WHARF BOATS—ORDINANCE REGULATING.

SEC. 519. No wharfboat shall, at any time, be moored at any point in this city, below the foot of Cumberland street.

SEC. 520. Each and every wharfboat shall, at all times, be under the immediate control and supervision of the common council, who may, from time to time, regulate the rates of wharfage, and make such rules and regulations in regard to the same as they may deem proper, and for the best interests of the city.

SEC. 521. Any owner or master of any wharfboat in this city, or other person having charge of any such wharfboat, who shall receive on such wharfboat any goods, wares, merchandise, chattels, or other property from any steamboat or other craft, running or being in the Arkansas river, shall not be allowed any wharfage for such freight, unless the same
