Proceedings of the City Council.

LOS ANGELES, July 27th, 1868.

Present—John King, President; Councilmen Jose Mascarel, George Dalton, A. A. Boyle, John Schumacher and L. Reeder.

Minutes of former meeting read, amended and approved.

Petition of Mariano Ruiz for title to tract of land whereon he now resides. Read and referred to Committee on Lands.

Petition of H. Hamilton, asking that the city printing be let by contract. Read and ordered that notice be given that proposals will be received to do the city printing until the 1st day of January, 1869, until the next meeting of this Council.

Report of the Mayor of sales of city lands and certain bills in connection therewith. Referred to Finance Committee.

Bill of Los Angeles NEWS; referred to Finance Committee.

Certain bills of Zanjero ordered paid.

Bills of Polaskie & Goodwin and S. Lazard & Co., referred to Finance Committee.

Resignation Wm. Kilgore as policeman received and accepted as of date.

Ordinance amending Water Ordinance passed.

Bill of Zanjero for work on zanjias ordered paid.

Message from the Mayor, refusing to sign a resolution passing certain lands to A. A. Boyle was read, and the same was sustained by the Council.

In the matter of the donation of 400 feet square of land on Fort Hill to Messrs Temple & Co. for the purpose of a reservoir, upon condition of the removal of the present reservoir, it was ordered that 200 feet square be granted those gentlemen.

Mr. Boyle offered a resolution requesting information concerning the proceedings of the Los Angeles and San Pedro Railroad Company.

Resolution passed, inviting Rev. J. J. Talbott to lecture in the Atlantic States, upon the climate, wealth and resources of Los Angeles.
