WATER PIPES.—The lessees of the City Water Works have laid down iron pipes from Los Angeles street through Aliso street to the "Aliso Mills," and down Los Angeles street to First, and are actively engaged in extending the pipes through Jail to Fort street. The pipes are of the most substantial character, and the fact that the city has been compelled to lay down over six thousand additional feet of pipe to accommodate the demands of the public, is an evidence of the rapid increase of population and business of the city.
