

To the Honorable General Assembly of
 State of Connecticut now sitting at Hartford
 humbly sheweth the memorial of the subscribers
 inhabitants of the town of Windsor in said ^{30a} State that your Memorialists have associated
 together for the purpose of forming and com-
 pleting an aqueduct to convey water from the
 land of Live Angdon one of your memorialists
 about hundred rods to the westward of the Swelling
 Horn of the said river, along the highway to the
 Swelling Horn of ^{the Memorialists} Celsia Strong in such manner
 as to supply your Memorialists and others who
 shall hereafter become proprietors of said aqueduct
 with water. That for the purpose of completing
 said aqueduct and keeping it in repair ~~it~~
 certain sums of money will become necessary to
 raise which by an equal voluntary agreement
 may hereafter be found impracticable at least extremely
 troublesome to execute which difficulties your Memorial-
 ists pray your Honours to incorporate them into
 a body politic with powers to sue and to defend in
 their corporate capacity in any court of law - With
 power also to appt on the members of said corporation
 in proportion to their several interests in said aqueduct
 such taxes as shall be found necessary from time
 to time for the purpose of perfecting and keeping in
 repair said aqueduct and the same taxes to
 levy and collect in such mode as to your Honours
 shall seem proper with power to the individual
 members having one or more shares in said aqueduct
 to sell or transfer any full share or shares in said
 aqueduct to any other individual or to relinquish
 and disclaim any right ⁱⁿ to said aqueduct, and in
 that case to be excused from any future contribution
 for the repairs or support of said aqueduct or any expen-
 ses relative thereto. With powers likewise to said
 corporation to admit new members and to increase
 the number of shares as they shall find convenient
 and with powers to do all things necessary for the
 well ordering and maintaining said aqueduct
