

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT.

Some Interesting Figures About the Wilkes-Barre Heat, Light and Motor Co

C. J. Cooper, superintendent of the Wilkes-Barre Heat, Light and Motor Co. in his report says the company has 323 accounts with consumers and we are heating 10,912,012 cubic feet of space, with 133,871 square feet of radiation or a little more than 80 cubic feet of space with one square foot of radiation.

The average daily consumption of coal for the season was 30 tons, 14 hundred weight, or a trifle less than three tonseight hundred weight to the boiler per day of 24 hours was 75, the minimum 5.

During the season of 1892-1893 24,635,388 gallons of water were used, and 31,948,880 pounds of coal burned, evaporating a little less than six pounds of water to the pound of coal.

The increase of income for the season of 1892-1893 is 20 per cent above the income of the season of 1891-1892.

On account of the opposition of residents the company has abandoned the idea of locating a second plant on Dana Place and will probably erect one in another part of the lower end of the city.

At the annual meeting on Tuesday a dividend of 5 per cent was declared made payable August 1st.
