to the engines used.

The company proposes to take city bonds at 70 cents on the doller. The above bid applies to bringing the water from South River. The same company proposes to bring water from the Chattahopchee for \$843,850.

Holly Manufacturing Company, represented by Yardley & Co., of Cincinnati, Ohio, \$424,-694, from South River; or \$270,527 additional, from the Chattahoochea. The work to be completed within six months.

Boston Machine Company \$57,000, or \$50,-000 according to machinery, for bringing water from South River; or \$104,000 for bringing from the Chattahoochee.

The above bid includes only engines and pumps.
