bered from one to one thousand and forty-nine (both numbers included), shall be paid in full before and in preference to the principal of any of the remaining nineteen hundred and fifty-one other bonds to be by the said mortgage secured; and that only so much of the interest for any year on the said bonds to which the parties assenting as aforesaid shall be entitled, shall be paid as the excess of the income and earnings of said company from the mortgaged property, over and above what may be necessary for the payment of the full interest for that year of the said one thousand and forty-nine bonds, numbered from one to one thousand and forty-nine, as aforesaid, shall be sufficient to pay; and the said mortgage may contain provision for ascertaining and determining what portion of the earning and income of the said property is to be considered as net for the purpose of paying such interest.

CHAPTER 344.

AN ACT to amend the charter of the city of Maysville.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

§ 1. That to provide means for the payment to the Maysville Water Company by the city of Maysville, under the provisions of their contract and of the water-works ordinance passed by said city December 27, 1879, for the perpetual use by the city of Maysville of certain fire hydrants and other apparatus of the water-works of the said Maysville Water Company, the board of councilmen of the city of Maysville shall have power, and it shall be its duty, to issue and sell, in time to make said payment, the coupon bonds of said city, to an amount not exceeding fifty thousand dollars, in such sums, and payable at such times, not exceeding twenty years, as the said board shall designate, bearing interest at the rate of six per centum per annum, payable semi-annually; and fifty thousand dollars of the proceeds of the sales of such bonds shall be applied by said board in accordance with the said water-works ordinance and contract.

§ 2. That the limits of the city of Maysville be, and the same are hereby, extended so as to include the site of the reservoir of the said Maysville Water Company on Newdigate's

hill; and it shall be the duty of the board of councilmen of the city of Maysville to cause the boundaries of such extension to be surveyed, and the corners thereof to be marked by durable monuments, and to cause a plat of such extension to be made and recorded in the clerk's office of the Mason county court.

§ 3. That the limits of said city be, and the same are hereby, further extended, so as to include under its jurisdiction all within the following extended boundary, to-wit: Beginning at the present terminus of the city line on Limestone creek, and running thence up said creek to the line between Nicholas Clooney and Robert A. Cochran; thence with their line and same course continued to the road leading from Lexington street to the Fleming turnpike, and thence with said road and the line of Chester to the city limits at Lexington street, in the 5th ward of said city, the said extended limits to be included in, and form part of, said ward.

§ 4. This act to take effect and be in force from its passage.

CHAPTER 345.

AN ACT to amend the charter of Bardstown.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

§ 1. That section five of article one of an act, entitled "An act to amend and reduce into one the various acts in regard to Bardstown," approved March 13, 1878, be amended by adding thereto the following proviso: *Provided, That all persons offering to vote in any municipal election in said town shall have paid all taxes assessed against them by said town on or before the 31st day of January preceding the election at which such person offers to vote.*

§ 2. Any person offering to vote at any municipal election in said town shall, upon challenge, produce his tax receipts or other evidence that he has paid his taxes as required in the first section of this act.

§ 3. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.
