IV. *And be it enacted and ordained,* That every owner of any carriage aforesaid, whose carriage shall not be numbered with black paint upon a white ground, in the centre of the middle pannel of each side, and of the back, with plain and conspicuous figures of at least three inches in length, on or before the first day of April next, shall forfeit and pay five dollars, for the use of the corporation, and a like sum for every week such carriage shall be employed for hire, and not numbered in the manner aforesaid.

An ORDINANCE to authorize a Lottery to raise a sum of money to be applied to the defraying of the expenses of conveying pure and wholesome water into the city of Baltimore, and of distributing it into the different parts thereof.
