For each bathing tub in private family.....	2 00
For each public bath house with one tub....	6 00
For each additional tub	4 00
For each store of 25 feet front or less.....	6 00
Over 25 feet and less than 50.....	10 00
For each office, from \$2.00 to	5 00
For each family in rooms over stores and offices	5 00
For each barber shop with one chair.....	4 00
For each additional chair	2 00
For each stable, including water for washing carriage, for one horse.....	3 00
For each additional horse	2 00
Dray and team horses, each	1 00

For each church, from \$5.00 to	10 00
For each bakery, per average daily use of flour, for each barrel	3 50
No bakery shall be charged less than	10 00
For each blacksmith shop with one forge.....	3 00
For each additional forge	2 00
Machine shops and foundries, including boilers, from \$50.00 to	100 00
Street sprinklers, for each cart or team, per month	15 00
For the right to attach a hose of not more than three-fourths of an inch orifice with nozzle not more than one-fourth of an inch in diameter, for washing windows or sprinkling gardens, in addition to the use for other purposes, the use of the same limited to four hours each day, \$3.00 to	12 00
Hotels, boarding houses, shops, manufactories, steam engines, saloons, groceries, provision and meat stores, breweries, livery stables, cold water engines, and all other places where water is used in large quantities, or where no rate is here fixed, at meter rates.	
Fountains at meter rates.	
Private fire hydrants, with double streams, for first hydrant	20 00
And for first single hydrant	15 00
And for each additional hydrant connected for hose	5 00
The minimum rate shall be per annum.....	5 00

METER RATES

In all cases where water is measured to the consumer or assessed by the month at meter rates, the rate is to be paid each month, and no meter rate shall be less than fifty cents per month where the smallest meter in use is attached; this minimum rate to be increased in proportion to the size and cost of the meter attached.

Provided, That where water is used for steam power or manufacturing purposes the rate shall be six and two-thirds cents per 1,000 gallons when the average daily consumption shall be under 19,000 gallons.
