

## CITY NOTICES.

### Proclamation for an Election on the Question of Water Works.

**WHEREAS**, the Common Council of the City of Kansas have passed an ordinance entitled "an Ordinance Concerning Water Works," approved April 1st, 1878, which said ordinance provides that the same shall be submitted to the qualified voters, and that those voting to approve the same shall vote on which shall be printed or written "Water Works Approved," and those voting to the contrary shall cast ballots on which shall be printed or written "Water Works Disapproved," and

**WHEREAS**, The said Common Council have passed another ordinance entitled "an Ordinance for the Erection of Water Works in the City of Kansas," approved April 1st, 1878; and

**WHEREAS**, The said ordinance should be submitted to the qualified voters for an expression of their approval or disapproval,

Now, therefore, notice is hereby given that at the election to be held on the 30th day of April, 1878, the following questions will be submitted to the voters of the city:

First. "On the approval or disapproval of the said ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Water Works." The ballots on that question shall, if for the approval of said ordinance, read "Water Works by Foreign Company Approved;" if against the ordinance, shall read "Water Works by the Foreign Company Disapproved."

Second. On the approval or disapproval of the said ordinance entitled "an ordinance for the Erection of Water Works in the City of Kansas." The ballots on that question shall, if for the approval thereof, read "Water Works by Home Company Approved;" if against the ordinance, shall read "Water Works by Home Company Disapproved."

There will be a separate ballot box for depositing the ballots on the Water Works question, and no voter shall cast but one vote upon that question. No ballot shall contain words relating to more than one of the propositions. The judges and clerks of election who act for the

election of city officers shall act as judges and clerks of election on this question, and shall open and close the polls for that purpose, receive and canvass the votes, and make returns in like manner as for the election of officers.

The poll books shall contain a separate column in which shall be noted those voting of the Water Works question.
