CHAPTER 177.

AN ACT IN ADDITION TO "AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE PROPRIETORS OF THE PORTSMOUTH AQUEDUCT."

SECT.

1. Limitation as to real estate.

2. Subject to repeal; takes effect—when.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

Limitation as to real estate.

SECT. 1. That the proprietors of the Portsmouth Aqueduct may take and hold real estate to the value of fifty thousand dollars.

Subject to repeal; takes effect—when.

SECT. 2. The general court may alter, amend, or repeal this act, whenever in their opinion the public good shall require; and this act shall take effect from its passage.

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE ELLIOT HOSPITAL OF THE CITY OF MANCHESTER.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Elliot, late of Manchester in the county of Hillsborough, deceased, by her last will and testament devised certain of her estate in trust for founding and maintaining a hospital in said city for the benefit of sick and disabled persons, and made provision in her will for the election of trustees for the management of said estate, and that said trustees should become incorporated; therefore,—

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

SECT. 1. That Horace B. Putnam, mayor of the city of Manchester, and William J. Hoyt, president of the common council of said city, *ex officio*; Charles R. Morrison, chosen by the Hanover Street Congregational church; Isaac W. Smith, chosen by the Franklin Street Congregational church; Moses French, chosen by St. Paul's Methodist Episcopal church; Joseph E. Bennett, chosen by the First Baptist church on Concord street; Harvey B. Sawyer, chosen
