3. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect immediately.

CHAPTER CCCXCIX.

An Act for the appointment of Commissioners in relation to supplying the city of Elizabeth, with pure and wholesome water.

1. BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey*, That the city council of the city of Elizabeth, shall on the first stated meeting of said city council, after the approval of this act, appoint five freeholders of said city who shall constitute a board to be known as the water commissioners of the city of Elizabeth. Commissioners shall be appointed.

2. *And be it enacted*, That it shall be the duty of the said commissioners and they are hereby authorized to examine and consider all matters relative to supplying the said city of Elizabeth with a sufficient quantity of pure and wholesome water for the use of the inhabitants of the said city, and the amount of money necessary to effect that object, and also to make an estimate and appraisalment of the actual cost and present value of the works and property of the Elizabethtown water company. Duty of the commissioners.

3. *And be it enacted*, That the said commissioners shall have power with the consent of the said city council to employ engineers, surveyors and such other persons as in their opinion may be necessary to enable them to fulfill their duties under this act. Engineers and surveyors to be appointed.

4. *And be it enacted*, That the said commissioners shall make a report of their proceedings under this act, which shall contain their opinion as to the best plan of furnishing the city of Elizabeth with a sufficient supply of pure and wholesome water, and an estimate of the expense of carrying such plan into effect, also the reasons and calculations upon which such opinion and estimate may be founded, and generally all such information connected with the object of such improvement as Commissioners to make report.

they may deem important, and also their estimate and appraisal of the works and property of the Elizabethtown water company.

Report to be made to legislature.

5. *And be it enacted*, That the said commissioners shall present a copy of said report to the city council of the city of Elizabeth, on or before the first day of December next, and their said report shall be made and presented by them to the legislature on the second Tuesday of January, eighteen hundred and sixty-nine.

Expenses and compensation to be paid by order of city council.

6. *And be it enacted*, That all reasonable expenses to be incurred under this act, and the compensation of the said commissioners, engineers, surveyors and other persons employed, to be fixed by the city council, and not increased or diminished during their term of office, shall be paid by order of the city council for which purpose they are hereby authorized to raise money by tax in the same manner as they are now authorized to do for the expenses of the said city.

7. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect immediately.

CHAPTER CCCC.

A Supplement to the act entitled "An Act relative to Commissioners for taking the Acknowledgment and Proof of Deeds," approved April fifteenth, eighteen hundred and forty-six.

May have four commissioners.

1. *BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey*, That hereafter it shall be lawful to appoint four commissioners for taking the acknowledgment and proof of deeds in the First ward of the city of Hoboken, in the county of Hudson.

Repealer.

2. *And be it enacted*, That so much of the act to which this is a supplement, and of the supplements thereto, as is inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be and the same are hereby repealed, and that this act shall take effect immediately.
