

**ELIZABETH.**—The Commissioners appointed by the last Legislature have made a report to the present Legislature relative to supplying the City of Elizabeth with water. The supply, it is stated, can be best obtained from the Rahway river at Cranford. The expense of conducting it to the city is estimated at \$32,855, and the cost of the works, including city distribution, at \$18,855. The low situation will require pumping machinery, in order to raise the water to sufficient height to supply the higher parts of the city. The cost, on this account, will then be \$73,113 per 1,000,000 gallons. The water of Rahway contains 90 per cent. of organic and 10 per cent. of organic matter. As already noticed a bill has been introduced for the appointment, by the Common Council, of a commission to erect the necessary works.
