debtcdness incurred in the erection, alteration, repairing and furnishing of school houses in school district number one, in the township of Plainfield, the trustees of said district are hereby authorized to borrow the additional sum of fifteen thousand dollars, and to issue bonds for the same, under their corporate name and seal, and which said additional bonds shall be issued and made payable, and be provided for and redeemed, as a supplement to the before recited act, approved February twenty-fifth, eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, authorizes and directs.

2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall be deemed a public act, and shall take effect immediately.

CHAPTER LXXXVIII.

A Further Supplement to an act entitled "An Act to authorize the Water Commissioners of Hoboken to contract for and introduce water into said city, and provide for the payment thereof," approved March twentieth, eighteen hundred and fifty-seven.

1. BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey*, That to enable the Water Commissioners of the city of Hoboken to defray the expenses which may be incurred in extending their water pipes throughout the city, the notes, bonds, scrip, or certificates of debt, which they are authorized to issue by the provisions of the third section of the act to which this is a supplement, may be extended to an amount in the whole not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars.

2. *And be it enacted*, That the proceedings of the several meetings of the board of water commissioners shall be published only in the newspaper published in the city of Hoboken having the largest bona fide circulation in said city.

3. *And be it enacted*, That the annual assessments of water rents provided for by the first section of the supplement of

the act to which this is a supplement, approved March first, eighteen hundred and fifty-nine, shall be extended to all lots and buildings where the water is taken by private pipes, whether the same are situated upon any road, street, avenue, lane, alley or court in the city of Hoboken, through or in which pipes for distributing the water are laid or not.

Repealer.

4. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect immediately, and that all acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER LXXXIX.

An Act amendatory to an act approved March eighth, eighteen hundred and sixty-one, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Board of Education of the City of Rahway."

Board of education, how composed.

1. *BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey*, That the board of education of the city of Rahway shall consist of one commissioner of public schools in and for each of the wards of said city, and one commissioner at large, who shall constitute and be known as the board of education of the city of Rahway.

How chosen.

2. *And be it enacted*, That at the next annual charter election in said city, and at each annual charter election thereafter, there shall be chosen by all the electors, one commissioner at large, and by the electors of each ward, one commissioner of public schools, who shall hold their office for one year.

When their duties commence.

3. *And be it enacted*, That the commissioners so chosen shall immediately enter on the duties of their office, and the places of the present school commissioners shall then cease and determine.

Limitation as to offices.

4. *And be it enacted*, That no member of the board of education shall be eligible to the office of superintendent of public schools in said city, nor to the office of secretary of said board.
