

 **THE BELLEVILLE WATER WORKS.**—An immense cylindrical tube 160 feet high, surmounted with a highly polished cap of brass, and decorated with the stars and stripes, was erected by the Jersey City Water Company, at their works opposite Belleville Friday. The intention is to take advantage of the principle in hydraulics of "water seeking its own level," by forcing the water from the river up into the tube, whence it arises to the proper height in the reservoir on the hill in the rear. Much expense is saved by this method, compared with the former one of forcing the water for about a third of a mile up the hill. It is believed that if such an arrangement could be carried out by the Aqueduct Company in this city that a much better supply of water could be obtained.
