and sufficient wagon ways or passages over or under the said railroad, where any public or other road may cross the same, and likewise, where required, suitable passage ways over or under said road for the accommodation of the farms through which the same shall pass, so that the passage of carriages, horses and cattle across said road shall not be prevented or obstructed thereby.

5. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect immediately.

CHAPTER CLXXII.

A further supplement to the act entitled "An act to regulate elections," approved April sixteenth, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six.

- Addition to 1. BE IT ENACTED by the Dentite with Assembly district in the the State of New Jersey, That the townships of West Hobomer of Hudson, be added to the fifth ken and Union, in the county of Hudson, be added to the fifth assembly district in the said county of Hudson.
 - 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect immediately.

CHAPTER CLXXIII.

A further supplement to an act entitled "An act to incorporate the New Brunswick Water Company," approved March first, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine.

Time extend-1. BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey, That the time for the commenceme

and completion of the works of the water company authorized by the act to which this is a supplement be extended for five years from the time fixed by said act.

CHAPTER CLXXIV.

An act for the relief of John Suter and Patience Venell, widow of James Venell, of the county of Camden.

1. BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of Pension to the State of New Jersey, That the treasurer of this state be and Patience and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to John Suter, of the county of Camden, and to the said Patience Venell, widow of the said James Venell, who were soldiers in the war of one thousand eight hundred and twelve, or to the order of each of them, the sum of fifty-two dollars per annum to each, during the term of the natural life of each of them, in equal semi-annual payments of twenty-six dollars each, the first payment to be made on the approval of this act; and the receipt of the said John Suter, or his order, and of the said Patience Venell, or her order, shall be a sufficient voucher to the treasurer for such sum or sums of money as he may pay by virtue of this act, in the settlement of his accounts.

2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect imme-

diately.
