ISSUE OF FRAUD—INSOLVENCY CASE.—In the 4th District Court, yesterday, the issue of fraud in the case of Julius Bornstein vs. His Creditors was tried before a special jury of six persons. Insolvent filed his petition November 26, 1858, and stated his liabilities at \$3000. He was engaged in the liquor business with Arnold Theller, who also filed his petition for the benefit of the insolvent act. Messrs. Park and White opposed the discharge of both applicants on the ground that they made away with their property and books, and confessed judgment in favor of A. Krahn, with a view to defraud their creditors. The jury, after hearing the evidence, found that Bornstein was not guilty of the fraud alleged. On the rendition of this verdict, counsel for opposing creditors withdrew the opposition interposed to the discharge of Theller.
