Chap. 46.

AN ACT to authorize the several school districts in the county of Herkimer, to purchase O'Conor's Map of Herkimer county.

Passed March 21, 1856, three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Maps to be purchased.

§ 1. The trustees of each of the several school districts in the county of Herkimer, are hereby authorized and empowered to purchase for the use of the schools in their several districts (if they in their discretion think best), one copy for each of said districts, of O'Conor's map of Herkimer county.

Library money used.

- § 2. The said trustees are hereby authorized and empowered to use any of the library moneys in their hands, a sum sufficient to pay for said map not exceeding the sum of five dollars.
 - § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

Chap. 47.

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An act to incorporate the Buffalo Water Works Company," passed March 15, 1849.

Passed March 21, 1856.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Ammal clostion, § 1. Hereafter, the annual election of directors of the Buffalo Water Works Company, shall be held on the first Wednesday of May, at such time of day and place in the city of Buffalo, as the directors for the time being shall appoint, giving at least four weeks public notice of said meeting.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
