§ 3. The city of Buffalo shall pay to the managers of the said The Payment Asylum of Our Lady of Refuge and the Ingleside Home of the city of for main-Buffalo, such sum not exceeding one dollar and fifty cents per week as by city the board of supervisors shall determine, for the maintenance of each and every person who shall be committed to said institutions under and in pursuance of this act; and the accounts of said managers for such support and maintenance shall be audited, and the payment thereof provided for, in the same manner as for other accounts against the city. § 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

## Chap. 553.

AN ACT to authorize the city of Buffalo to issue its bonds for the purpose of extending the supply of water to the city and its inhabitants.

Passed June 9, 1875; three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. It shall be lawful for the city of Buffalo to raise money, Extending the supply of water to the city and its inhabitants, and for supply, such purpose it shall be lawful for the common council of said city, by a vote of two-thirds of all the members thereof, to authorize the issue of the bonds of the said city to an amount not exceeding two hundred Bonds. thousand dollars, bearing interest at the rate of not more than seven per cent. per annum, the interest to be paid semi-annually, and the principal to become due and payable in not less than ten or more than twenty years from date, said bonds to be sold at not less than their par value.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

#### Chap. 554.

AN ACT to authorize the common council of the city of Buffalo to discontinue East street between Parish and South streets, and Dearborn street between Parish and Tonawanda streets.

Passed June 9, 1875; three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The common council of the city of Buffalo is hereby authorized to discontinue East street in said city of Buffalo, from Parish street to South street, and Dearborn street from Parish street to Tonawanda street, upon the petition of the owners of two-thirds in number of feet of the property fronting on said East and Dearborn streets, between said Parish and South streets and Parish and Tonawanda streets respectively, and upon such conditions as said common council shall by resolution provide.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
