## Chap. 213.

AN ACT to authorize the common council of the city of Rochester to raise money to enlarge and erect school buildings to relieve the over-crowded schools of said city.

PASSED April 25, 1884 ; three-fifths being present.

*The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

Common council may raise additional sum of \$42,500.

SECTION 1. The common council of the city of Rochester is hereby authorized and empowered to raise in addition to the amount authorized by the city charter for building purposes the sum of forty-two thousand five hundred dollars for the purpose of purchasing school sites and erecting school buildings and additions thereon to relieve the over-crowded schools of said city.

Tax.

§ 2. Such amount as the said common council shall by resolution designate for that purpose not exceeding forty-two thousand five hundred dollars shall be assessed and collected together with the other general city taxes for the present fiscal year.

§ 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

## Chap. 214.

AN ACT for the relief of the Canandaigua Water-works Company.

PASSED April 30, 1884 ; three-fifths being present.

*The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

Company declared duly incorporated.

SECTION 1. The Canandaigua Water-works Company having obtained from the authorities of the village of Canandaigua, duplicate certificates of determination, granting its application to supply said village with pure and wholesome water, which certificates were signed April fourth, eighteen hundred and eighty-four, upon a vote duly taken, allowing the same, within thirty days after their application therefor; or on the twenty-eighth day of November, eighteen hundred and eighty-three, and having filed said duplicate certificates of determination in the office of the clerk of said village of Canandaigua, and in the Ontario county clerk's office, as required by chapter seven hundred and thirty-seven of the laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-three; and having thereafter filed in said county clerk's office and the office of the secretary of state certificates of organization, said Canandaigua Water-works Company is hereby declared to be duly incorporated, notwithstanding any defect in any proceedings had for the purpose of the organization of said company after said vote of the said village authorities, and before the proceedings hereinabove recited.

Bonds and stock legalized.

§ 2. The first mortgage bonds heretofore issued by said Canandaigua Water-works Company to the amount of one hundred thousand dollars, and the mortgage given to secure the same, dated January twenty-six,

eighteen hundred and eighty-four, and the stock also issued by said company, are, and each of the same is legalized, ratified and confirmed, and shall exist as valid securities in all respects as though said company had been duly organized at the time of issuing or executing the same, and notwithstanding any defect in the organization thereof.

§ 3. All conveyances, contracts and agreements heretofore made, or executed, by or to such company, or in the name thereof, or by or to any of its officers, trustees or agents, and being such as said company if lawfully organized, might make or execute, are hereby ratified and confirmed in all respects with the same force and effect as though said company at the time of such making or executing had been duly organized and notwithstanding any defect in the organization thereof.

§ 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

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## Chap. 215.

AN ACT to provide for the erection of a village hall in the village of Clifton Springs, in the county of Ontario.

PASSED April 30, 1884; three-fifths being present.

*The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The president and trustees of the village of Clifton Springs, in the county of Ontario, are hereby authorized and empowered to purchase for and in the name of said village such property in said village as may be proper for a village hall, and to erect thereon a village hall, the entire expense thereof not to exceed five thousand dollars.

§ 2. The said president and trustees shall cause one thousand dollars of the cost and expenses of purchasing said property and erecting said hall to be raised by assessment and tax as is provided for by law in case of ordinary expenditures of said village, such assessment to be made within thirty days after the passage of this act; and they shall borrow on the credit of said village the sum of four thousand dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary for payment of the remainder of the cost and expenses of said property and hall, to be paid in four equal annual installments with annual interest at a rate not greater than six per cent per annum; and shall issue the bonds or certificates of said village therefor, payable on the first day of November in each year, the first installment to be payable on the first day of November, eighteen hundred and eighty-five.

§ 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
