§ 3. No person or persons shall, with any kind of net, seine, or in any manner whatever, during the months of December, January, February and March, take fish of any kind, except suckers and eels, from the waters named in section one, under a fine of five dollars for each fish so taken.

#### Chap. 293.

AN ACT to amend chapter three hundred and eighty of the Laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-six, authorizing the Trustees of the village of Ellenville, Ulster county, to borrow money.

Passed April 10, 1867; three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section second of an act entitled "An act to authorize the trustees of the village of Ellenville to borrow money for the purpose of introducing water into the village, and to control and regulate the use of the same," passed April fifth, eighteen hundred and sixty-six is hereby amended by adding thereto as follows: The trustees are hereby authorized to raise the interest due or to become due on said bonds from time to time, by a general tax upon the taxable property liable to be assessed for taxes in such village, when the moneys raised from the selling, leasing or renting of water, as provided in such act, shall be insufficient to meet the same.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
