LAWS OF NEW YORK.

Chap. 618.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and fifty-six of the laws of eighteen hundred and fifty-seven, entitled "An act to incorporate the Malone Water Works Company," and authorizing said company to purchase, take and hold real estate for the purpose of supplying the town of Malone with pure and wholesome water.

Became a law, April 23, 1900, with the approval of the Governor. Passed, three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Scnate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section nine of chapter one hundred and fifty-six of the laws of eighteen hundred and fifty-seven, entitled "An act to incorporate the Malone water works company," is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Acquisition of land, etc., for water supply.

Laying of pipes, etc.

Charter amended.

> § 9. For the purpose of supplying Malone village and the town of Malone with pure and wholesome water, the said company may purchase, take and hold any real estate, and by their directors, agents, servants, or other persons employed, may enter upon the lands of any person or persons which may be necessary for said purpose, and may take such water from any springs, ponds or streams, as may be determined by the commissioners appointed as hereinafter named, and divert and convey the same to said village and to any part of said town; and may lay and construct any pipes, conduits, aqueducts, wells, reservoirs, or other works or machinery necessary or proper for said purpose, upon any lands so entered upon, purchased, taken or held. Said corporation may, as aforesaid, enter upon any lands, streets, highways, roads, lanes, or public squares, through which they may deem it proper to convey the water from said springs, ponds, streams, wells, and reservoirs, and lay and construct any pipes, conduits, aqueducts, or other works, for that purpose leaving the said lands, streets, highways, roads, lanes and public squares, in the same condition as nearly as may be as they were before said entry, but the said company shall not lay and construct said pipes, conduits, aqueducts, and other works, through any private garden or building lot without the written consent of the owners thereof.
