Accordingly, a wooden pipe was made, about sixteen feet high, and of the same di-A ameter as the discharge pipe from the reser-The services of a diver from New York u were procured to clear away the rubbish, and A put the pipe in place. p C On Wednesday, the Water Commissioners, ti together with President Bailey, and Messrs. c Swalm and Robertson, of the Board of Trus-C tees, Dr. Draper, Judge Wilkin, and others, t visited the reservoir with the diver to witness q the operation. Having donned his submarine armor, he descended about half-past one o'clock, and remained under about half an 7 hour to reconnoitre and learn the situation. 1 He again descended after a short time with a d crowbar and other tools. and cleared away y the obstructions, and inserted the upright wooden pipe we have spoken of. This was properly fastened and anchored, and the wa-0 ter let in, and was found to work admirably. The diver again descended to see that all was d right, and before five o'clock the work was all t accomplished. We trust there will be no furither cause for complaint about the smell and e taste of the water. 38 The Commissioners, Trustees, and all conf cerned, deserve great credit for the ingenuity e and energy displayed in this contrivance to remedy the difficulties occasioned by the unfortunate destruction of the tower.
