

MANHATTAN WATER WORKS

The President and Directors of the Manhattan Company have resolved the following Regulations.

1. Subscribers for water shall not supply families of persons with Manhattan water, but use it for their own families living on the premises to which it is taken.

2. A reward of Three Dollars will be paid at the Water Office, No 7 Reed street, for sufficient proof of conviction for this offence.

3. No lateral pipe shall be connected to the main or pipes of conduit without being authorized by the contractor.

4. Persons removing to houses which are supplied with water will please to give notice at the water office if they wish the supply continued, otherwise they will be charged as the premises were formerly.

5. The price for supplying houses will be as formerly for private families, viz:

1 to 3 families \$5, and \$1 25 for each additional fire place more than that number. If there is more than one family, the additional price of \$50 will be added. Grocers as usual \$10. Boarding houses, taverns, eating houses and manufactories, according to private agreement.

6. Payment to be made as usual, half yearly in advance.

7. The company warrant a constant supply of water in their pipes of conduit, but not in the lateral pipes (therefore no deduction will be made for freezing, or for the bad order of the lateral pipes, as they are the property of the occupants or proprietors of the premises, and are by them to be kept in repair.

8. If accidents happen to the Water works, public notice will be given, and a proper deduction made accordingly. By the erection of new additional works the Company expects the supply will be permanent and abundant, and the inhabitants are requested to keep their lateral pipes and cocks from leaking.
