house upon the public square in said town and district, which said public square is described as follows: "Beginning at the north-west corner at a stake, nineteen links west of a creek; thence running along a line of marked trees, north fifty-two degrees east, ten chains to a stake cornered; thence south thirty-eight degrees east, along a line of marked trees, seven chains and fifty links to a stake cornered; thence south fifty-two degrees west, ten chains to a stake; thence north thirty-eight degrees west, seven chains and fifty links to the place of beginning, containing seven and a half acres, according to a survey of the said square made by Brot. White, dated Trenton, June nineteenth, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight."

§ 2. Nothing in this act shall in any wise affect any suit or proceedings in law, commenced prior to its enactment.

§ 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

Chap. 488.

AN ACT to provide for the payment of the water furnished to the State Prison at Sing Sing, by the corporation of the city of New-York.

Passed April 15, 1857, three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New-York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Water at prison. Section 1. The comptroller shall pay to the register of the Croton aqueduct department, eight thousand six hundred and twenty-seven dollars and fifty cents in full, for the Croton water furnished to the state prison at Sing Sing by the corporation of the city of New-York, from the first day of May, eighteen hundred and fifty-one, and to be furnished until the first day of May, eighteen hundred and fifty-seven.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
