

ROCHESTER WATER WORKS.—A meeting of certain citizens and some of the Aldermen was held in the Mayor's office, on Friday evening, to consider the Water Works question. Mayor Moore occupied the chair. A proposition made by a Connecticut contractor—a Mr Easton, of New Haven—was discussed. This gentleman, it is stated, is willing to undertake to supply the city with water on his own account. It is said he will ask of the Common Council to pledge the city to pay \$20,000 per year for public water, and accept of one hundred and fifty hydrants instead of four hundred—the number first named. Instead of fifty miles, he proposes to lay ten miles of iron pipes—the remainder to be of wood, or whatever material he shall see fit. A majority of the meeting did not seem to favor this project. A committee was appointed to report the action of this meeting at the next meeting of the Common Council, after which it adjourned.
