ROCHESTER WATER WORKS .- A meeting of costain citizens and some of the Aldermen was held in the Mayor's office, on Friday evening. to consider the Water Works question. Mayor Meore occupied the chair. A proposition made by a Connecticut contractor-a Mr Raston, of New Haven-was discussed. This gentleman, it is stated, is willing to undertake to supply the city with water on his own account. It is said he will ask of the Common Council so pledge the city to pay \$20,000 per year for public water, and accept of one hundred and fixy hydrants instead of four hundred-the number first named. Instead of fifty miles, he proposes to lay ten miles of iron pipes-the remainder to be of wood, or whatever material he shall see fit. A imajority of the meeting did not seem to favor this project. A commilitee was appointed jo report the action of this meeting at the next meeting of the Common Council, after which it adjourned.
