#### NOTE ON MAPS DISPLAYED ON END-PAPERS

*Rochester in 1815* is taken from the Field Notes of Lemuel Foster, surveyor; see Rochester Historical Society, *Publication Fund Series*, XII, 182.

Elisha Johnson's *Map of Rochester in 1827* was drawn for use in the first *Rochester Directory*, published by E. Peck in 1827.

The Cornell *Map of Rochester* (1861), shows only slight alterations from his new map used in the 1859 *Directory*. See R. H. S., *Publications*, IV, 267, for a discussion of these *Directory* maps. The population in 1860 was 48,204.

The Drew, Allis Co., *Map of Rochester in 1900*, is the *Directory* map of that year. It should be noted that the ♣ marks locate churches, while the ▲ marks locate school buildings. The population in 1900 was 162,608.

The *Outline Map of the Rochester Metropolitan Area* as fixed by the U. S. Census authorities of 1930 shows how nearly the city has come to dominate Monroe County.

The portion of the *Maps of Ontario and Steuben Counties*, which first appeared in Charles Williamson's *Description of the Genesee Country* (Albany, 1798), carries us back to an era in the history of Western New York before Rochester had been founded. See R. H. S., *Publications*, X, 120.
