In the counties of Steuben and Richmond, three thousand five hundred dollars each.

Schoharie
and others
\$2,500.

In the counties of Schoharie, Cortland, Sullivan, Genesee, Essex, Orleans, Tioga, Tompkins, Wyoming and Suffolk, two thousand five hundred dollars each.

Putnam
and others
\$1,500.

In the counties of Putnam, Yates and Schuyler, one thousand five hundred dollars each.

Seneca
\$1,000.

In the county of Seneca one thousand dollars.

Allegany
\$2,700.

In the county of Allegany, two thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars.

Fulton
\$2,250.

In the county of Fulton, two thousand two hundred and fifty dollars.

Hamilton
\$800.

In the county of Hamilton, eight hundred dollars.

Provision
for coun-
ties where
offices are
separate.

Whenever in any county where there is now a separate county judge and surrogate, the supervisors shall decide to have but one officer to act as county judge and surrogate, the salary of such officer shall be five hundred dollars less than the aggregate salary herein allowed to the county judge and surrogate of such county.

§ 2. This act shall take effect on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and seventy-eight.

CHAP. 36.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and four of the laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-four, entitled An act to amend an act, entitled "An act in relation to the Syracuse city water-works company, passed April fifth, eighteen hundred and forty-nine."

PASSED March 6, 1877.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The second section of an act, chapter one hundred and four, laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-four, entitled "An act to amend an act, entitled 'An act in relation to the Syracuse city water-works company,' passed April fifth, eighteen hundred and forty-nine," is amended so as to read as follows, namely:

Capital
stock may
be in-
creased.

§ 2. It shall be lawful for said company to increase their capital stock from three hundred thousand dollars, to such an amount as shall in the judgment of the board of directors be advisable, not exceeding one million of dollars, and such increase may be made from time to time, as shall by said board of directors be deemed expedient.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
