AN ACT to incorporate the Williamsville Water Company.

Passed April 18, 1838.

The People of the State of New-York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

§ 1. John Hutchinson, Job Bestow and William Horner, Corporation and their associates and successors, are hereby constituted a body corporate, by the name of "The Williamsville Water Company," for the purpose of supplying the inhabitants of Williamsville, in the county of Erie, with pure and wholesome water; and by that name shall have power to purchase, hold and convey real and personal estate, provided such real estate be necessary to attain the object of this incorporation; and the capital stock of said association shall consist of one hundred shares of ten dollars each.

§ 2. All the provisions of the act entitled "An act to in-general corporate the Burlington Flatts Aqueduct Association," pas-powers. sed May 11, 1837, shall apply to the incorporation hereby created, except as herein otherwise provided; the town of Amherst to be understood whenever the words "the town of Burlington" occur in said act.

§ 3. The three persons herein before named, shall be the Trustees. first directors, and hold their offices until the first Tuesday of May, eighteen hundred and thirty-nine, and until others shall be chosen in their stead.

§ 4. The legislature may at any time alter, modify or re-Right to repeal this act.
