Chap. 801.

AN ACT to revive, continue in force and amend the act entitled "An act to incorporate the Yonkers Water Company," passed April twelfth, eighteen hundred and sixty-five.

Passed April 25, 1867.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The act entitled "An act to incorporate the Yonkers water company," passed April twelfth, eighteen hundred and sixty-five, is hereby revived and continued in force in all respects, the same as if the corporators therein named had commenced the transaction of business under the provisions of said act, and notwithstanding any omission on their part so to do.

§ 2. The first section of said act is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

§ 1. John T. Warring, William Radford, Robert P. Getty, Orrin A. Bills, Justus Lawrence, James P. Sanders, George Osterheld, Asa Hinkley, Robert J. Douglass, William Hutchings, Horace P. Whitney, Edwin B. Dusenbery, and Thomas H. Collins, and all such persons as shall or may hereafter be associated with them, are hereby constituted a body corporate by the name of the "Yonkers Water Company."

§ 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
