said commissioners that work to twenty-five per cent more than that amount has been done according to contract.

Sec. 3. Said commissioners are hereby authorized to borrow any sum of money not exceeding twenty thousand dollars, at a rate of interest not exceeding seven per cent. per annum, which they may deem necessary for the purpose aforesaid, and to execute therefor any instrument or assurance which may be necessary to secure the payment of the interest thereon, and the principal at such times as may be agreed upon: said commissioners are also hereby authorized and required to levy such annual tax as may be necessary to pay the interest upon said debt, and finally the principal at such time or times as may be specified in the contract.

Sec. 4. Said bridges shall forever be free to all the inhabitants of said county of Coshocton: such tolls may be required from non-residents who may cross the same, as shall be prescribed by the said commissioners: *Provided*, That said tolls for crossing each bridge, shall never exceed those allowed in like cases for crossing the upper bridge at the town of Zanesville: *And provided also*, That said commissioners may make said bridge free to all persons, whenever they shall deem it expedient to do so.

AN ACT

To authorize the Town Council of the town of Newark, to borrow money.

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio*, That the Town Council of the town of Newark, and their successors in office, be, and they are hereby authorized to borrow, on the credit of the corporation of the town of Newark, in the county of Licking, a sum of money not exceeding ten thousand dollars; which money, when borrowed, under the provisions of this act, shall be applied to the improvement of said town, under the direction of the town council.

Sec. 2. That the annual revenue of said town, is hereby pledged for the redemption of any loan which may be made under the provisions of this act.

AN ACT

To increase the capital stock of the Fairport Aqueduct Company

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio*, That the stockholders of the Fairport Aqueduct Company, may at any time

hereafter augment the capital stock of said company to ten thousand dollars; to be divided into shares of twenty-five dollars each, whenever, at a special meeting of such stockholders convened for that purpose, of which at least ten days previous notice shall have been given by publication in some newspaper printed in the county of Geauga, two thirds of all the votes shall be given therefor, under such regulations, conditions, and restrictions as they shall at such meeting judge proper; and the stock subscribed by virtue hereof shall be subject to all the by-laws, rules and regulations of said company.

AN ACT

To lay out and establish a graded State road in the counties of Carroll and Stark.

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio,* That Charles Fawcett, of the county of Carroll, and John Augustine, of the county of Stark, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners, and Daniel Black of Carroll county, surveyor, to lay out and establish a graded state road; commencing on the graded state road, from Cadiz to Congress Furnace, where the county line between the counties of Harrison and Carroll crosses the same; thence through Leesburgh, on the nearest and best route to Waynesburg, Stark county; thence the nearest and best route to Osnaburg, in said county of Stark.

Sec. 2. That said road shall in no case exceed an angle of five degrees with the horizon.

Sec. 3. That the commissioners aforesaid shall, in all respects be governed by the laws in force, defining the mode of laying out and establishing state roads; and should either of said commissioners die, or remove out of the county, or refuse to serve, the commissioners of the county in which such vacancy may occur are hereby authorized to fill the same.
