*An Act*

Relative to the per capita tax to be assessed by the water directors of the town of Aaronburg, county of Centre.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the water directors of the town of Aaronburg, county of Centre, shall have power to assess a per capita tax upon the taxable male inhabitants of the same, not exceeding one dollar and fifty cents annually; and that all laws, inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

*An Act*

In relation to bounties, in the township of Montgomery, in the county of Franklin.

WHEREAS, The citizens of Montgomery township, Franklin county, Pennsylvania, petitioned the court of quarter sessions of said county for the appointment of an auditor, to examine and audit the bounty accounts for said township : Preamble.

*And whereas,* The auditor appointed made report, and the said report was confirmed by the said court :

*And whereas,* In and by said report it appears, that the school directors of said township levied and assessed a tax of four per cent., for bounty purposes ; that at the time of said levy, the act of twenty-fifth August, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, restricted them to levying and collecting a tax, not exceeding two per cent., in any one year ; that the school directors had changed the valuation of real estate, as fixed by the tri-ennial assessment, in viola-
