3 Further Supplement

To an act, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Northampton (now Allentown) Water Company," approved February thirteenth, one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, and its several supplements.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That in addition to the powers heretofore granted and conferred upon the president and managers of the Allentown Water Company, located at the late borough, now city of Allentown, in the county of Lehigh, they shall have the liberty, privilege and power to lay reasonable assessments, in the nature of water rents, upon every dwelling house situated in any of the streets, lanes and alleys of the said city, in through and along which, and as far as the water pipes of the said company are now laid and shall hereafter be laid, and to collect the said assessments or rents in the same manner as water rents are now collected.
