Provided, The same shall not be inconsistent with the laws of Proviso. this commonwealth. The officers of said company to consist of officers. a president, secretary, treasurer and five directors.

SECTION 2. The said company shall have the right to connect Privileges. their said water course with the canal on the south side of the basin of Blanchard, Craig and Company, instead of going through said basin, should they see fit so to do; and shall have the right to charge and collect tolls on all boats or flats entering said May collect tolls. water course, and on all lumber, timber, saw-logs and other commodities whatever, transported on or floated through said water course, or any part thereof, not exceeding the following rates, to wit: On each boat or flat passing in or out of said Rates of. water course, for each trip, one dollar; on each thousand feet, board measure, of lumber, timber or saw-logs, twenty-five cents ; and on all other freight, twenty-five cents per ton; and the said company shall be required to keep open a channel of not less Required to keep than forty feet in width through said water course, for the passage open a channel of certain width. of boats, et cetera ; the right to charge tolls to commence when the said water course shall have been completed to the present When tolls may be charged. embankment on the south side of Bellefonte avenue.

SECTION 3. The capital stock of this company shall not exceed Capital. thirty thousand dollars, in shares of fifty dollars each; and it shall be lawful for any company or body corporate within this commonwealth to subscribe for said stock, in addition to the Subscriptions. individual subscriptions that may be made.

SUPPLEMENT

To an act incorporating the Bethlehem Water Company, approved February twenty-fourth, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the president and managers of the Bethlehem water company Protection tax shall be and are hereby authorized to lay and assess yearly and authorized. every year, a tax, to be called a protection tax, upon the owners

and occupiers of all lots having any building or buildings erected thereon, within the borough of Bethlehem: Provided, That no tax be laid or assessed upon any lot having any building erected thereon not bounding on a street where a water pipe of the company is laid opposite thereto, or within one hundred yards from said pipe: Provided also, That each protection tax shall not exceed the sum of three dollars on a front not exceeding Lot owners or oc- sixty feet: And provided further, That no such protection tax cupiers paying shall be laid and assessed upon lots whose owners or occupiers pay water rents for the use upon said lots of the water furnished by the company.

SECTION 2. That the president and managers shall have power to appoint some suitable and competent person as collector of water rents, to whom a warrant shall be issued by the president and countersigned by the secretary, authorizing and requiring Duties and pow- him to demand and receive from the owners or occupiers of lots, such water rents and protection tax as shall have been laid and assessed by authority of the board of managers, in the same manner and with like power and authority to enforce the collection of the same, as is now or may hereafter be conferred by law upon the collector of county taxes; and the board shall have the right at all times to make such abatements and exonerations as to them shall appear just and reasonable.

AN ACT

Legalizing the Township Elections in Cameron county.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That township elections for the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, in the county of Cameron, be and the same are hereby legalized; and all officers elected at said elections, shall have, hold and exercise their several offices as fully and effectually as though the said elections had been held under an act of assembly authorizing the same; and the supervisors and road commissioners so elected, shall exercise their offices during the

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
