A Further Supplement

To an act, entitled "An Act appointing commissioners to lay out and open a State road, in the counties of Cameron and Potter," approved the twenty-first day of March, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall be lawful for said commissioners to borrow money and issue bonds, as provided in the tenth section of the act to which this is a further supplement, approved the fourth day of April, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, to an amount not exceeding six thousand dollars, in addition to the amount authorized by the said act of twenty-first day of March, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five; and should the road commissioners, named in the original act, fail to make the annual levies of taxes, as provided in said supplement to said act, then it shall be the duty of the county commissioners for the counties of Potter and Cameron, to make such levies, from year to year, until said bonds, with the interest payable thereon, are all fully paid and discharged.

A Supplement

To the act, entitled "An Act authorizing the Columbia Water Company to hold real estate, and so forth," approved tenth February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,*

| Authorized to hold land. | That from and after the passage of this act it shall and may be lawful for the Columbia Water Company, at Columbia, Lancaster county, of this state, in addition to the other powers and privileges which the said company already possess, to purchase, hold and enjoy, in fee simple, any number, not exceeding one hundred and fifty, acres of land, for the purpose of supplying the citizens of Columbia, and its vicinity, with water, for domestic and manufacturing uses. |

| Votes, relative to. | SECTION 2. That in elections of directors, and in deciding all questions, at meetings of shareholders, each stockholder shall be entitled to one vote on each share of stock held by him; and shareholders may vote by proxies, duly authorized in writing. |
| To supply water, without charge, for extinguishment of fire. | SECTION 3. That it shall be the duty of the said water company to supply water for extinguishing fires in Columbia, free of expense, to such hydrants, or plugs only, as shall be erected by the borough of Columbia; and the said borough is hereby required to erect such hydrants and plugs as may be necessary to supply water in time of fire. |

An Act

Relating to bounties in the borough of Dillsburg, in the county of York, and State of Pennsylvania, validating and legalizing the assessment, duplicate and warrant to collect bounty tax, assessed in June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, in said borough.

Preamble. **WHEREAS,** The citizens of Dillsburg, in the county of York, after due notice, held a public meeting, at which they unanimously agreed that the borough authorities should levy a tax in order to raise a bounty to pay volunteers, to free said borough from the draft, and in order to secure volunteers immediately, nine of said citizens borrowed six hundred dollars and put in two volunteers, being assured by the town council that they would, at once, levy a tax to pay the money thus borrowed; and in accordance with said promise the said town council assessed a tax in June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and ordered a duplicate to be made out and issued, with warrant attached, for the collection of the same :
