of the auditors and the costs of such proceedings shall be paid out of the bounty funds of said township. Fees and costs.

SECTION 2. That the auditors that may be appointed to examine and audit the bounty accounts aforesaid, shall have power to re-audit any bounty accounts of said township which may have been heretofore, in whole or in part, audited, with like effect as if such accounts had not been audited, and subject to the approval of the court, as hereinbefore provided; and the said auditors, for the purposes of such audit, shall have power to administer oaths. Auditors may re-audit bounty accounts.

SECTION 3. That all balances of money due from any person or persons to the bounty funds of said township, after payment of all indebtedness of said township for bounty purposes, shall be paid over by such persons to the treasurer of the school fund of said township, for the uses and purposes of the said school fund. Balances to be paid to treasurer of school fund.

SECTION 4. That the said court shall have authority to direct process to be issued for the collection of any and all balances which may be found due from such persons, on a judgment to be entered in court on such auditors' report after its final confirmation; said process to issue in the name of the township of Kingston. Court may direct process to issue for collection of balances.

SECTION 5. That the auditors aforesaid, in addition to the report to be made out and filed in said court, shall keep a record of all proceedings had before them, in a book to be procured by them for that purpose, and after they shall have finished their auditing shall make out a full and complete statement of all the moneys received and paid out for bounty purposes in said township during the late war, and enter the same in said book, and be attested by their signature thereto; which said book shall be deposited in the office of the clerk of the court of quarter sessions of said county, for safe keeping and for reference to persons desirous of inspecting the same. An Act

Further to increase the capital of the Columbia Water Company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,*

Increase of capital stock authorized.

That the president and managers of the Columbia Water Company be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to increase the capital stock of the said company from time to time, and in such sum or sums as they may deem advisable, to the amount of one hundred thousand dollars, and no more.

President and managers may sell real estate, &c., of company.

SECTION 2. That the president and managers aforesaid be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to sell and convey all and singular their real and personal estate, together with the rights, privileges and franchises of the Columbia Water Company, to any person or persons or corporation, for such sum or sums of money as shall be agreeable to the stockholders thereof holding a majority of shares; and such purchaser or purchasers shall have and enjoy and exercise all and singular the rights, privileges, immunities and franchises had and enjoyed by the said company, as fully and effectually as they were held and enjoyed by the said Columbia Water Company; and the said purchaser or purchasers are hereby created a body politic, in law and in fact, with the enjoyment of all the rights and subject to all the restrictions now or heretofore held and enjoyed by the said company or to which they are now subject.

An Act

To authorize the directors of the poor of Lebanon county to sell certain real estate.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That the board of directors of the poor and of the house of employment for the county of Lebanon be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to sell and convey, by deed, in fee simple, for such price as they may agree upon, that portion of the poor house farm of said county which lies northward and near the public road leading from Lebanon to Newmans-town, and is bounded on the north by lands of Joseph Heilman and Isaac Hoffman, on the east by lands of Rudolph
