An Act

Relating to the compensation of the sheriff of Butler and Indiana counties, for boarding prisoners.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the court of quarter sessions of the peace of the counties of Butler and Indiana shall have the power to increase, or decrease, from time to time, the compensation of the sheriff of said county, for boarding prisoners, in the county jail, and fix the sum at any amount thought reasonable and just, not to exceed fifty cents per day for each prisoner.

No. 550.

An Act

Relative to the borough of Kennett Square, in the county of Chester, enabling said borough to borrow money to erect water works, changing the mode of publishing ordinances, and opening, widening and straightening streets, in said borough.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,*

Chief burgess and town council authorized to borrow money and issue certificates of indebtedness therefor.

That the chief burgess and town council, of the borough of Kennett Square, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to borrow, on the credit of said borough, any sum, or sums, of money, not exceeding eight thousand dollars, and to issue certificates of indebtedness therefor, under the corporate seal of said borough of Kennett Square, attested by the chief burgess and town clerk, for the time being, in sums of not less than one hundred dollars, payable at the expiration

of twenty years, from the date of issue, and redeemable at the option of said borough, at any time after five years, from said date of issue, at a rate of interest not exceeding six per centum per annum; which interest shall be payable annually, to the holder, or holders, of such certificate, or certificates; and the said chief burgess and town council shall have authority, and they are hereby authorized, from time to time, and as often as the same may be necessary, to raise, by taxation, in the manner pointed out by existing laws, for that purpose, such sum, or sums, of money, as will be necessary to pay the principal and interest, or the interest alone, of said certificate, or certificates: *Provided*, That such money, when borrowed, shall be applied to the erection and construction of water works, and to the introducing of fresh water into the said borough, in such manner, and from such sources, as may be determined upon, by said chief burgess and town council.

Authorized to raise by taxation certain sums.

Proviso.

SECTION 2. That as much of the fourth provision of the third section of an act, approved April third, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, entitled "An Act regulating boroughs," requiring the corporate officers of boroughs, to publish enactments, regulations and ordinances, or other general laws, ordered, or passed, by the burgess and town council, in one newspaper, et cetera, at least ten days before the same take effect, is hereby repealed, so far as the same relates to the borough of Kennett Square, in the county of Chester; and the publication of such ordinances, regulations, or general laws, by twelve written, or printed, notices, put up in the most public places in said borough, shall be deemed lawful and sufficient advertisement thereof.

Repeal.

Publication of ordinances, &c., relative to.

SECTION 3. That an act, approved April second, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, entitled, "A supplement to an act regulating boroughs, approved April third, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one," is hereby repealed, so far as the same relates to the borough of Kennett Square, in the county of Chester, and like proceedings shall be had for the opening, widening and straightening of the roads, streets, lanes, courts and alleys, laid out and ordained, in said borough, as are provided, by law, for the laying out and opening of public roads within this commonwealth.
