



AN ORDINANCE

For regulating the distribution of water in
the City of Philadelphia.

Section I. Be it ordained and enacted by
the Citizens of Philadelphia
in Select and Common Councils assembled,
That John Inskip, John Miller, junior,
Thomas P. Cope, Samuel M. Fox, Timo-
thy Paxton, William Poynell, William
Young, Thomas Parker, Isaac Snowden,
junior, William Dawson, David Smith,
and Jacob Chrystler, be, and they are
hereby, appointed Commissioners for the
purpose of superintending the distribution
of the Water, to be supplied by the steam
engines, under the following rules and re-
gulations.

Section II. Be it ordained and enacted
by the authority aforesaid, That it shall be
the duty of the City Commissioners, when
required by the Commissioners above men-
tioned, to aid and assist in carrying into execu-
tion all and every of their requisitions
touching the distribution and use of the
water aforesaid.

Section III. Be it ordained and enacted
by the authority aforesaid, That the sub-
scribers to the loan, made in conformity
to the "Ordinance providing for the rais-
ing of a sum of money, on loan, for sup-
plying the City of Philadelphia with whole-
some water," passed on the seventh day of
February, in the year one thousand seven
hundred and ninety nine, before whose
houses the pipes of conduit are now laid,
shall be entitled to the use of the water in
their dwelling houses, agreeably to the
terms and conditions of the said ordinance,
for and until the completion of three years
from the first day of July next and no lon-
ger, and all other subscribers to the said
loan shall be, in like manner, entitled to
the water for the term of three years after
the pipes of conduit shall have been laid
in the streets before their houses, and sup-
plied with water for the space of thirty
days.

Section IV. Be it ordained and enacted
by the authority aforesaid, That any citi-
zen who is not a subscriber to the said loan,
and who shall make application to the said
Commissioners, on or before the first day
of July next, to have a supply of water
from the pipes of conduit, shall be entitled
to receive the same at the rate of five dol-
lars per annum, to be paid in advance, for
a private dwelling house, and Brewers,
Sugar-chopers, Hatters, Soap-boilers, Inn-
keepers, Dyers, Curriers, and others, who
will require the water for other purposes
than the supply of their private dwelling-
houses, shall be supplied at a rate to be mu-
tually agreed upon between the applicant
and the Commissioners. *Provided*, That
the rates, so to be established, shall be in a
ratio with the rate for the supply of pri-
vate dwellings, and shall not continue in
force for more than three years from and
after the first day of July next. All mon-
ies arising from water rent shall be col-
lected by the said Commissioners, or their
properly authorised agents, and be forth-
with deposited in the Treasury.

Section V. Be it ordained and enacted
by the authority aforesaid, That the sup-
ply of water, for private dwelling-houses,
shall be communicated from the pipes of
conduit through a ferule, the internal dia-
meter whereof shall in no instance exceed
half an inch, and for other than private
dwelling-houses the supply may be taken
through a ferule of such dimensions as
may be authorised by the said Commissio-
ners.

Section VI. Be it ordained and enacted
by the authority aforesaid, That the sub-
scribers to the said loan shall be authorised
to transfer the water rights attached to
their shares, and any person or persons to
whom such rights shall be transferred shall
be entitled to all the privileges of the ori-
ginal subscribers for each and every share
transferred—All transfers shall be made
in the presence of the Treasurer of the
Corporation.

Section VII. Be it ordained and enacted
by the authority aforesaid, That if any
person shall wilfully injure the pipes of con-
duit, the hydrants; or any device attached
to the water works, he or she shall forfeit
and pay a fine not less than thice, nor more
than fifty dollars at the discretion of the
court, or other competent authority before
whom the offender shall be convicted, to be
recovered with costs, one-half to the use
of the prosecutor and the other to the city.
