CHAPTER XCV.

An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to borrow twenty thousand dollars, in order to raise a sum of money, which shall be appropriated towards defraying the expense of supplying the city with wa-

Mayor authorized to borrow \$20,000.

I. That the Mayor of the city be, and he is hereby authorized to borrow, on loan, any sum or sums of money not exceeding twenty thousand dollars, and to issue therefor certificates, under the seal of the corporation, of one hundred dollars each, bearing an interest of not more than six per

Certificates centum per annum, which interest shall be made payable of stock, bear-half yearly at the Bank of Pittsburgh, except so much as 6 per cent. & may be borrowed in Philadelphia, the interest on which interest to be shall be paid semi-annually at the Bank of the United paid half States in Philadelphia; and the certificates so issued shall yearly at the be signed by the Mayor, and counter-signed by the treasu-U.S. bank in rer, and shall be severally transferrable by the subscribers Philadelphia. or their legal attorney, executors, administrators or assigns, by endorsement thereon at the office and in the presence of the treasurer of the city for the time being, and shall not Loan not to be paid or reduced by the city except with the consent of
