#### CHAPTER CXVII.

An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to borrow the sum of fifteen thousand dollars for supplying the city with water.

Mayor authorized to borrow \$15,000.

I. That the Mayor of the city be, and he is hereby authorized to borrow on loan, any sum or sums of money not exceeding fifteen thousand dollars; and to issue therefor certificates under the seal of the corporation of one hundred

to be issued.

Certificates dollars each, bearing an interest of not more than six per of \$100 each cent. per annum; which interest shall be made payable half yearly at the bank of Pittsburgh; and the certificates so issued shall be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the

transferable urer's books.

Stock to be treasurer, and shall be severally transferable by the subscribers or their legal attorney, executors, administrators. on the treas- or assigns, by endorsement thereon, at the office and in the presence of the treasurer of the city for the time being, and shall not be paid or redeemed by the city without the consent of the holders thereof, before the first day of July, in the year eighteen hundred and thirty-five. And the moneys so borrowed shall be paid to the city treasurer, and applied by him exclusively to the payment of warrants, drawn for the purpose of defraying the expense of supplying the city with water.

Loan to be applied to water-works only.

II. That the faith, credit, funds, revenue and corporate property of the city be, and they are hereby solemnly pledged for the amount hereby authorized to be borrowed as aforesaid, and for the payment of the interest of the same.

Property pledged for re-payment.

#### CHAPTER CXVIII.

An Ordinance for the emission of city bills.

That the city treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized \$3000 of and required, to sign, date, number and issue, the blank city bills to city bills, now remaining in his hands, to the amount of be issued by three thousand dollars, bearing interest from the date of the city treather missions and the said hills when so issued, shall be their emission; and the said bills when so issued, shall be surer. redeemable and payable in fines, forfeitures, debts and taxes now due, and hereafter to become due to the city, and that the faith and corporate property of the city be pledged for the redemption of the same.
