

This Indenture made the thirtieth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty two Between the Springfield Water Company a corporation of the State of Pennsylvania of the one part and The American Pipe Manufacturing Company a corporation duly incorporated under the laws of the State of New Jersey and doing business in said State of Pennsylvania of the other part

Witnesseth that the said Springfield Water Company for and in consideration of the sum of ten thousand Dollars lawful money of the United States of America unto it well and lawfully paid by the said The American Pipe Manufacturing Company as and for the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged has granted bargain sold aliened enfeoffed released and confirmed and by these presents does grant bargain sell alien enfeoff release and confirm unto the said The American Pipe Manufacturing Company its executors and assigns,

All that certain tract or piece of Land with the Buildings and Improvements thereon erected. Situate in the Township of Springfield County of Delaware and State of Pennsylvania bounded and situated as follows:

Beginning at a stone at the intersection of a road leading from the Turnpike by Joseph Downes gate and the Chester Road to the corner of land formerly of Joseph Downes now of J. Howard Adams.  perches, thence still by land of said Lewis North seventy one degrees and
 three quarters West four and three tenths perches to a stone and South thirty
 seven degrees West six perches and sixteen one hundredths to a stone a
 corner of land late of Joseph Gibbons deceased, thence by the same South
