A Supplement

To an act to incorporate the Uniontown Gas and Water Company.

Additional cor-
porators.Powers and
privileges.Majority of cor-
porators may
carry into effect

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That George Morrison, William W. Williams, Thomas B. Schnatterly, Julius Shipley and Thomas B. Searight, be and they are hereby added to the list of persons named as corporators in an act, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Uniontown Gas and Water Company," approved the twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and invested with like powers, privileges and authority respectively with the original corporators.

SECTION 2. A majority of all the corporators named in the act to which this is a supplement, and in this supplement, excluding the names of the original corporators now dead, are hereby authorized and empowered to carry into effect the provisions, objects and purposes of the act to which this is a supplement.

SECTION 3. It shall be lawful for the commissioners of Fayette county to contract with the aforesaid gas and water company for a supply of gas or water, or both, for the public buildings of said county; and the burgess and town council of Union borough may contract with said company for a supply of water or gas, or both, for the public buildings of said borough.
