AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE PAWTUCKET FOUNTAIN COMPANY.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows :

SECTION 1. John Bayley, Royal Lee, William Earle, John Horswell, D. D. Sweet, A. H. Adams, B. E. Gardner, L. Fairbrother, and their associates, now or hereafter to be admitted members of said company, are hereby made and constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name and style of the Pawtucket Fountain Company, to be located in the village of Pawtucket, in North Providence, for the purpose of supplying the inhabitants of said village and vicinity, with pure fountain water; with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities, set forth in chapter one hundred and twenty-five (125) of the revised statutes.

Corporators.

Objects of the company.

Capital stock \$5,000.

SEC. 2. The capital stock of said company shall consist of five thousand dollars, in shares of fifty dollars each, and may be increased to any amount less than fifty thousand dollars, at any legal meeting of said company, specially notified for the purpose.

Laying pipes.

SEC. 3. Said company may excavate and lay their pipes for conducting water along and under the streets and town highways in said village of Pawtucket, North Providence; *provided*, the same be done with the consent and under the direction of the town council of said town of North Providence.

Of laying pipes.

SEC. 4. Said company may excavate and lay their pipes for conducting water along and under such portions of the Providence and Pawtucket turnpike, as pass through said village; *provided*, the same be done with the consent and under the direction of the agent of the state, for said turnpike; and may also, with the consent and under the direction of said agent, lay their pipes along the bridge hereafter to be built over the Pawtucket river in connection with said turnpike.
