

The Water Works Proposition.

Sec. 1st grants the right of way and the franchise for 25 years.

Sec. 2 Provides penalty for injuries done works.

Sec. 3 The city reserves the right to purchase works after five years, and establishes basis of value, being gross amount of cost of construction, and 15 per cent, over and above original cost and 12 per cent clear net earnings per annum.

Sec. 4. The city rents 50 fire hydrants at \$150 per annum each.

Sec. 5. Regulates capacity of hydrants.

Sec. 6. The city can use hydrants to wash gutters, and for public buildings and for fountains in every square free of charge.

Sec. 7. Fixes maximum water rates as follows:

ANNUAL WATER RATES.

Yard Hydrants, for each room in house \$1,50.

No connection for less than \$6,00.

Dwellings, per each room in house, \$2,00.

Bath tub, private, \$5,00.

Bath tub, public, \$10,00.

Urinal, private, \$5,00.

Urinal, public, \$10,00.

Stores, from \$6,00 to \$25,00.

Other rooms in same building shall be charged according to occupancy.

Business offices, \$6,00.

Banks and Insurance offices, \$10,00.

Saloon, \$10,00 to \$50,00.

Hotel and boarding houses, special or meter rates.

Hose privilege for livery stable, \$20,00 to \$50,00.

Street and yard sprinklers for irrigation per front foot of premises, not over 200 feet deep, 10 cts.

Livery stables, per stall, \$2,00.

Private stables, per stall, \$3,00.

Work horse, mule and cow per stall \$1,50.

Bakeries, per annum, for each barrel of flour used daily, \$5,00.

Printing offices, exclusive of engine, \$10,00 to \$25,00.

Building purposes, per 1000 bricks 10 cts.

Stone work, per perch, 10 cts.

Steam engine, horse power, \$6,00.

Breweries, for each barrel brewed, 5 cts.

Restaurants, \$20,00 to \$100,00.

Barber shops, first chair, \$7,50.

Barber shops, each additional chair, \$3,00.

For purposes not enumerated in this table of prices, a price not exceeding prices charged at Kansas City, Mo., and Quincy, Illinois, may be charged and collected.

METER RATES.

Not to exceed 1000 gallons, 60cts.

Sec. 8. The city agrees to pass all necessary ordinances to protect Water Works.

Sec. 9. The city agrees to denote grounds for the Water Works not exceeding two acres and at a valuation not exceeding \$1000. Also all the stone necessary to erect works.

Sec. 10. Sixty days to accept contract in.

Sec. 11. That the water works shall be sufficient to supply \$75,

000 people, with 30 gallons of water each per day.

Sec. 12. That the works shall be completed within 15 months from 1st Oct. 1875. Also regulating distribution of water.

Sec. 13. Allows citizens of San Antonio to take $\frac{1}{4}$ of stock.

Sec. 14. The company to render an account to the city of actual cost of works and all extensions every six months thereafter, for five years or until city purchase some.
