

**ALEXANDRIA WATER WORKS—CAST IRON PIPES, &c.**—Sealed proposals will be received by the undersigned, until the 20th day of June, 1851, for furnishing and delivering the following described Cast Iron Pipes, designed for the Water-Works about to be constructed for the town of Alexandria, Va.

They are to be made of the best quality of Cast Iron, to be full to the diameter given, to be nine feet long and made in the usual form and thickness of Water Pipes, and are to be proved in a hydrostatic press under a head of 300 feet, under the direction and inspection of the Engineer of the Company, and at the expense of the contractor. The whole to be delivered at the town of Alexandria on any landing which may be provided by the Company for the purpose; the delivery to be in the following order, viz: one sixth of each kind of Pipes monthly from the time of signing the contract, until the whole shall be delivered.

The proposals will also, state the price per ton (of 2240 lbs.) for common castings used in the construction of Water Works, such as branches, reducing pipes, frames and covers, &c., &c., to be inspected and delivered in the same manner as the pipes. The proposals will further state the manner and time payments will be required to be made and how much, if any, of the stock of the Water Company will be taken in payment.
