CHAP. 160.—An ACT for the relief of Richard Crenshaw and C. Pate, of Bedford county, Virginia.

Approved February 27, 1879.

Release	1. Be it enacted by the general assembly of Virginia, That Richard Crenshaw and his surety, C. Pate, both of Bedford, be and they are hereby relieved and released from all further obligation of every kind on account of a bond executed by him to the board of directors of the Western lunatic asylum for the support and maintenance at said institution, after his majority, of Samuel C. Crenshaw, as a lunatic, and from the payment of all and every unpaid instalment due or to become due under the requirements of said bond: provided, however, that this relief is granted and accepted with the distinct understanding that there shall be no demand or liability upon the state or the Western lunatic asylum for any amounts already paid by the said Crenshaw.

CHAP. 161.—An ACT to amend and re-enact the second section of an act entitled an act to incorporate the Portsmouth Water Company, approved February 15, 1879.

§ 1 act approved February 15, 1879, amended	1. Be it enacted by the general assembly of Virginia. That the second section of an act approved February fiftieth, eighteen hundred and seventy-nine, entitled an act to incorporate the Portsmouth water company, be amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows:
Purposes and objects of company	§ 2. The purposes and objects for which said company is incorporated, and which it is authorized to effect, are the construction, on any plan that may be approved, of reservoirs, force-pumps, engines, and any and all fixtures and appurtenances necessary therefor, and the laying of pipes, main and lateral, to convey water from lake Drummond, or from the Dismal swamp canal, or from Deep creek in Norfolk county, or from such other points as may be deemed most suitable, into the city of Portsmouth, and the Gosport navy-yard, and United States naval hospital, and to such other points or places in Norfolk county as the government of the United States may own and desire water to be carried to; and for these purposes the said company shall have all the grants, rights, privileges, and franchises necessary to carry into effect the purposes, objects, and intents of the said company.
Commencem't	2. This act shall be in force from its passage.
