No. 228.—AN ACT TO AMEND AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE NORTHFIELD HOUSE AQUEDUCT COMPANY, APPROVED NOVEMBER 29, 1882.

*It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:*

SECTION 1. Section one of number one hundred and forty-four of the acts of 1882 is amended by inserting the word "twenty" after the word "exceeding" in the fourth line thereof.

SEC. 2. Section seven of said act is hereby amended by inserting after the name of G. M. Fisk the names of I. N. Jenks or W. N. Richardson.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect from its passage.

No. 229.—AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE BARRE AQUEDUCT COMPANY.

SECTION

1. Corporators; name; purposes.
2. First meeting; by-laws.

*It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:*

SECTION 1. James M. Perry, John Trow, Hiram O. Worthen, Herbert O. Camp, and their associates and successors, are hereby constituted a body corporate by the name of the Barre Aqueduct Company, with all the powers incident to corporations, and may hold real and personal estate not exceeding fifty thousand dollars in value, for the purpose of constructing and maintaining an aqueduct with reservoirs and appurtenances for supplying the inhabitants of the village of Barre with pure spring water for domestic and other purposes.
