said Dummerston and easterly of the west line of the main public highway, as established by the recorded survey thereof, leading from the village of Putney through said Dummerston to the Putney railroad station, is hereby annexed to and made a part of the town of Putney in the county of Windham.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect from its passage.

No. 274.—AN ACT TO LEGALIZE AND CONTINUE THE ORGANIZATION OF THE ST. JOHNSBURY AQUEDUCT COMPANY.

It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

SECTION 1. The surviving corporators of the St. Johnsbury Aqueduct Company are hereby authorized to choose such number of associate corporators as they may desire, and with such associates and successors, to continue the organization thereof.

SEC. 2. Said surviving corporators and their associates chosen as above provided, may elect officers, and continue, and exercise all the powers and rights of said corporation in accordance with its original charter and the amendments thereof in the same manner that they could have done had none of the original corporators deceased.

SEC. 3. The re-organization of said corporation, when effected as above provided, is hereby declared legal and valid.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect from its passage.

No. 275.—AN ACT TO RELEASE WILLIAM P. NASH, OF NEW HAVEN AND JOSEPH BATTELL OF RIPTON FROM LIABILITY ON A BOND TO THE STATE.

It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
