CHAPTER 286.

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "an act to incorporate the Janesville Manufacturing and Hydraulic Company," approved March 13, 1855.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Section one of an act entitled "an act ^{Amended.} to incorporate the Janesville Manufacturing and Hydraulic Company," approved March 13, 1855, is hereby amended to read as follows: J. B. Doe, Alexander Graham, Ira Miltimore, John Watson, Anson Rogers, ^{Corporators.} A. C. Bates, Joseph A. Wood, R. B. Treat, Hiram Merrill, G. A. Libby, Henry Crane, James Bintliff, J. D. Rexford, C. B. Withington and Joseph James, and such other persons as shall associate with them and become stockholders, pursuant to the provisions of this act, shall be and are hereby created and made a body politic and corporate, in fact and in name, by the name and style of the "Janesville Manufacturing and Hydraulic Company," with perpetual succession, and by ^{Name and powers.} that name shall have all the privileges, franchises and immunities incident to a corporation, to wit: they shall be capable in law of purchasing, holding, leasing and conveying estate, either real, personal or mixed, and in their corporate name may sue and be sued, may have and use a common seal, which they may alter at pleasure, and generally may do all and singular the matters and things which they are authorized by law to do, for the interest and well being of said company, and shall further have and possess all the rights, powers, franchises, immunities and privileges granted to the original incorporators in the act hereby amended: *provided*, the real estate to be held by this corporation at any one time shall not exceed two hundred thousand dollars.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
